The Awesome youth/Gelding award is back! At each show we will award one youth with their awesome gelding a cool prize. Youth will have to enter their gelding by filling out a nomination form and writing a small story about their Horse. One winner per NWMHC show will be awarded.

GELDING INCENTIVE FUND

- 1. Owner must be a current member of the NWMHC. Points accumulated from the date membership paid.
- 2. Points are awarded per NWMHC point system
- 3. Horse must have been born in the Northwest. Horses born outside the Northwest receive one-half points. "Northwest" is defined as AMHA Region 8, British Columbia and Alberta, Canada.
- Horse must compete in at least THREE (3) – sponsored shows. Points can only be earned from Gelding specific classes.
- 5. A portion of each Gelding class entry fee will be allocated to the Gelding Incentive Fund: \$3.00 per horse per judge in Open Gelding classes \$2.00 per horse per judge in Amateur Gelding classes \$1.00 per horse per judge in Youth Gelding classes
- 6. All payouts will be made to the owner of the horse and distributed at the Year-End Awards Banquet.
- 7. Only NWMHC sponsored shows are eligible for accumulation of points. Points will be awarded based on the horse only.

Membership

Remember you need to be a NWMHC member to Qualify for our year end awards. Youth Must show at two shows and everyone one else must show at three shows.

The versatility awards also require Membership.

Test for Dwarfism in Miniature Horses

The gene responsible for dwarfism in Miniature Horses is called the aggrecan gene (ACAN).

DNA testing for 4 mutations of the gene is being offered at the University of Kentucky Animal Testing and Research Laboratory. The mutations were found by a PhD student, John Eberth, at the UK Gluck Equine Research Center. John is studying under Ernie Bailey PhD, professor of genetics and genomes at the Center.

The 4 mutations of the gene are different from skeletal atavism which is a type of dwarfism seen in the Miniature Horse and Shetland Ponies. ACAN mutations are also dissimilar from osteochondrodysplasia dwarfism seen in such breeds as the Freesians. The mutated genes are named D1, D2, D3 and D4.

Since horses that are carriers of ACAN mutations do not exhibit any of the characteristics of dwarfism, it's encouraging that tests are available now to discover which of the mutations is present.

One of the mutations causes early abortion or absorption of the fetus. Two of the mutations produce a dwarf foal with many physical problems.

Researchers strongly advise against breeding carrier males and females together. Results of such a breeding are serious health issues.


